### **Equipment Planning for Juravinski Hospital Redevelopment**

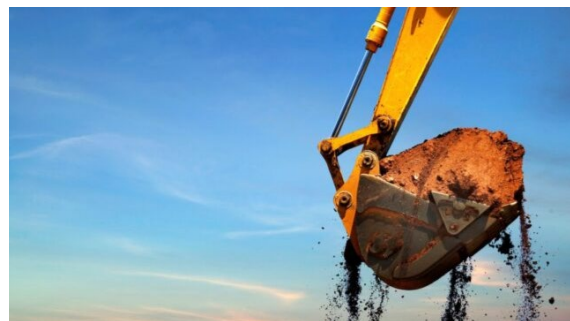
